



I would like to thank the outgoing Lord Dean Dewar and members of the previous committee for all their hard work, Ex Dean Menzies who has been most valuable with his knowledge of building standards, see report on page 3 of Dunc 'on the job' at our property at 5 Atholl Place, which we are in the process of selling. The last tenants vacated 2 years ago and we have been unable to find a new tenant, so we decided to try and sell due to the increasing costs of keeping a large vacant property indefinitely. Thanks also

to Tom Rorrison for his invaluable work keeping our newsletter going.

I've had invites from Horsecross/Perth Theatre and thoroughly enjoyed Don Juan, quite funny and glad to see the theatre at full capacity again. We were able to share with our members a talk which was given to the Court of Deans of Scotland by Professor Christopher Whatley I hope those that managed to watch enjoyed it. We have also issued NTS tickets to those who requested them, I hope you have had the opportunity to get out and visit, I thought it was a nice gesture since we've not been able to travel far this last 18 months.

August saw the presentation of a £5000 cheque to Letham4all to assist them in the purchase of a minibus to assist members of their community to attend events/medical appointments etc, the committee thought this was a great cause as this will allow families to be able to visit other places that they many have never have had the opportunity to see, such as the seaside.

In September we had the assistance of Ex Deans Anderson and Harding who offered their valuable time to adjudicate the applications for non-member bursaries and this year saw a total of 35 lucky applicants. The committee voted to increase the bursary to £1000 from next year.

The development of the Guildtown land is going well and we have been receiving the payments in tranches from A&J Stephen as work progresses. Some of which has been invested with Charles Stanley our stockbroker, other monies we hope to use for a Guildry legacy project.

The Lord Deans Project for my term is to assist the community by donating Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). This is very personal to me as my father sadly died very suddenly 41 years ago due to a cardiac arrest and the recent tv coverage of Christian Eriksen collapsing during the 2020 Euros highlighted the effectiveness of available AEDs. We have had requests from two local amateur football clubs and also the residents of Guildtown for such devices and I'm delighted to say we will assist.
